Grade Level News

Kindergarten is warming up to the Holiday Season! We are looking forward to the magical performance of the "Nutcracker" at the Bardavon Opera House. After a fabulous performance of the "Wizard of Oz", we are excited to compare performances. Both theater experiences will give us the opportunity to connect what we have learned in story elements to live theater productions!

November had First Grade busy learning about the Lenape, Native Americans of this area, and Pilgrims. We even wrote our own Native American picture stories! We also learned about the First Thanksgiving and compared it to how we celebrate today to see what was alike and/or different. In reading, many of our students moved up in their reading levels and we will be reading non-fiction books next. And in writing, we have been finishing up our Small Moments stories and getting ready to show off our hard work to our families at one of our Annual Writers Celebration in December.

For the month of December, second grade will be learning about different holidays and traditions around the world. Students will get to create their own gingerbread houses and enjoy a winter celebration. We will be ending the unit on engineering with some fun class activities and beginning a new unit on matter. In math we will focus on double and triple digit addition and subtraction without regrouping. We are looking forward to a celebratory December!

It is hard to believe that December is upon us! The 3rd graders have worked hard in all areas and have moved with ease into the 2nd quarter of school. At the end of October, we enjoyed our trip to Common Ground Farm. While we were there we visited with the animals in the barn, made pickled carrots with Chef Katie, and took a walk to the crops to harvest carrots for our recipes. We had a lot of fun working together with both classes on a candy pumpkin STEM challenge. Students worked together to create the tallest structure using candy pumpkins and toothpicks. In ELA, we are working on our final writing piece about how the texts we read have taught us to appreciate the value of reading and learning. In Science, we are currently working on writing our animal reports, students have chosen an animal of their choice to study in depth. In Social Studies, we will be touching on holidays around the world as we head into the holiday season. In Math, we are continuing to work on multi-step word problems and telling time. 3rd grade wishes everyone had a happy and healthy Holiday Season!

Can you believe we are already in the second quarter? Our fourth graders are finding out how important it is to memorize their multiplication facts! Here is what is happening in MAPS Grades 4-6

HEALTH SERVICES MESSAGE

<u>ILLNESS</u>—Students are <u>coming</u> to school not feeling well and complaining of symptoms of illness <u>after</u> they arrive at school. Once these students board a school bus and/or arrive to their classrooms, they may have already contributed to the spread of contagious infections or disease.

Students should not be sent to school with instructions to "go to the school nurse and see what is wrong." The function of school health services is not to diagnose or treat the sick child. We may only administer First Aid/Emergency care.

We ask that the parents not send students to school with any of the following symptoms:

ELEVATED TEMPERATURE: A student should not be sent to school until his/her temperature has been <u>normal for 24 hours.</u>

NAUSEA OR YOMITING: If a student has vomited during the evening, night or prior to coming to school, he/she should not be sent to school.

OTHER SYMPTOMS: Excessive cough, complaint of sore throat accompanied by headache, muscular aches or pain are also symptoms of illness.

The student who is not feeling well cannot benefit from instruction and in addition he/she may cause a spread of infections. Also, once a child returns to school from an illness, he/she should be ready to participate in all school activities, such as physical education, outside recess, etc. The only exceptions are current medical exemptions that we have on active file. Generally, a note from a parent requesting that a child not participate in regular school activities is not acceptable.

<u>CAST AND/OR CRUTCHES</u>—Before a student returns to school wearing a cast or using crutches, the parent should obtain a note from the physician stating the diagnosis and also, a statement that they may attend school and if there are any physical restrictions. Parents should contact the Health Office prior to the day the student will return to discuss any adjustment necessary to the student's program.

Please be aware that some of our students here at JV Forrestal suffer with severe and sometimes fatal food allergies. We are asking that if parents want to distribute goodie bags to the children, no candy or home baked foods be in them. We are also asking that any food brought into school be cleared through the classroom teacher.

The following are a few important reminders:

- Keep the main office updated with any address/phone changes that may occur throughout the school year. If there is a change
 from your child's normal routine for dismissal a note must be sent to your child's teacher. Call the school only if an emergency
 arises before 2:00pm. Any calls received after 2:00pm cannot be honored due to the safety of your child and his/her normal dsmissal procedure will be followed.
- It is very IMPORTANT that ach child arrives on time every day especially if they are going to eat breakfast in school. Breakfast will only be served between 8:30 A.M. and 8:45 A.M. Please instill in your child an awareness of the importance of being in school and on time each and every day. Please note, no student will be allowed to enter until 8:30am.

• Arrival:

Only bus students will be permitted to enter into through the main entrance. Parents in need of assistance must have ID, sign in, and enter in through the main entrance only. All walkers in K – Second Grade will enter in through the Kindergar ten Entrance.

All walkers in grades 3-5 will enter in through the Valet Entrance.

When using the valet service, please remember to have your child exit the vehicle from the passenger's side only.

• Dismissal:

Only bus students will be permitted to exit through the main entrance. Parents in need of assistance must have ID, sign in, and exit through the main entrance only.

All walkers in K - Second Grade exit through the Kindergarten Entrance.

All walkers in grades 3-5 will exit through the Valet Entrance ** Including Ms. Gall's class.

Thank you to all that are making our new arrival and dismissal procedures safer for our students and each other.
