Grade Level News

During the month of May, pre- K will review the letters and their sounds. They will be making gifts for their mom's for Mother's Day and have our VIP tea party. We will continue to learn about Habitats. We will work on rhyming words. We will also continue to work on sequencing a story. We will continue to numbers and counting.

Eggciting things are happening in Kindergarten! We are eggspecting our new arrivals in a couple of weeks! Also in May, we will continue our Beacon Community exploration!

Happy May Flowers! First Grade Geometricians are hard at work with learning all about both 2D and 3D shapes. These brave mathematicians have been studying the different characteristics that make these shapes unique and special. To conclude our Animal units students will be going to the Bear Mountain Zoo to look at animals that live in New York State. In Social Studies we have been learning about maps and our community. May is also the start of our realistic fiction unit where students will learn how to identify different story elements. Enjoy this May Sunshine!

Greetings from Second grade! As we transition into May, we are excited for the learning adventures ahead and the activities that come with spring. We will continue our exploration of measurement. Soon, we will move on to Geometry and fractions, where students will practice identifying shapes and understanding parts of a whole. We are wrapping up our unit on Poetry. Students are focusing on using more detailed and colorful language, including idioms, similes, and onomatopoeia. Next, we will begin a unit on Insects, where students will research and create persuasive arguments about whether specific insects are harmful or helpful. In Social Studies, our current topic is comparing Beacon long ago to the present.

We are so excited for May in 3rd grade! This month our big focus will be preparing for the 35th Calico Ball! Students in Mrs. Regg's class are studying and learning a native dance from Russia. Mrs. Ciotoli's class is studying and learning a native dance from Yemen! Everyone is excited and working hard already! We are also looking forward to our trip to Hudson Highlands Nature Center in mid-May. Students will have the opportunity to engage in indoor and outdoor activities that correlate to our ecosystem unit in Science.

4th grade is looking forward to celebrating our big achievement of State Testing! We have also enjoyed our annual Clearwater Sail on the historic Sloop. Up ahead, we have many fun units to learn still including an ELA unit all about healthy food choices, decimals, and the Revolutionary War!

The Fifth graders have been working hard on multiplying and dividing fractions! We are looking forward to end-of-the-year activities!

Mrs. White's - In May, our classroom will become a campsite! Students will continue learning about plants and insects while also getting to learn vocabulary and concepts surrounding a camp theme! In our first two weeks, our awesome student teacher, Ms. McKinney will be leading the room! All students will be learning all about coins in our math workshop and work on identifying the coins, discovering their values, and adding them! In phonics, our kindergarteners will continue to explore CVC words in two new word families. First and Second graders will finish reviewing vowel-consonant-e words and begin exploring r-control (ar/er/ir/ur) sounds! Keep up the great work Room 6!

Mrs. Reinoehl's - Room 5, During the month of May we will be discussing what type of animals we see at the zoo, why they are there, and who takes care of them. 
