# **Grade Level News**

In November, Pre-k will continue our alphabet letter studies of D,E, F,G,H, and I. We will continue to work on counting 1-5. We will learn about Thanksgiving and families.

There is so much to be thankful for in Kindergarten. We are well into our Kindergarten year. We are thankful for our family, our friends and especially our time together in school!

Our Fabulous First Graders are learning so much this fall! Last month we enjoyed our trip to Storm King Art Center and back in the classroom we created our own giant art sculptures using the Engineering Design Process to guide us. We also learned all about Plants & Trees - their parts, roles/jobs, how they make their own food, and the seasons of a tree. This month in our Harvest Unit we will explore and expand our knowledge of Plants and Trees to learn how we get foods from Farm to Table. In Social Studies we will learn more Social Emotional Skills & Awareness with our Being Thankful Unit. In reading we are Word Detectives in Training! We are learning what it takes to tackle those tricky words we come across. And in writing we are learning to add more details to our Small Moment stories and to go back and check our story for punctuation, capitalization, and if it makes sense. Lastly, we can't wait to meet with parents this month for Virtual Parent Teacher Conferences to discuss your wonderful children and the progress they are making! Happy Thanksgiving!

In November, second grade will be doing some great work. We will be investigating Nonfiction text features in books and showing what we have learned in our writing. We will be learning about place value and starting regrouping in math. We will discuss our country's government in social studies and start o explore slow and fast earth changes in science. We can't wait to meet with you

We can't believe the first quarter is almost over!! Third graders have been doing a great job adjusting to school and learning all of our classroom routines and expectations. We are about to wrap up our very first math module on multiplication and division. Students finished a geography unit and did a wonderful job putting together their geography flip books. In ELA, we are continuing to practice important reading skills and strategies while also learning to write a complete paragraph. All students have been working super hard and we are so proud of them.

Fourth grade has begun learning about the Iroquois. They lived in what is now known as New York. We just finished area and perimeter and we're on to multiplication!


