Grade Level News

Pre-K has finished the first part of our school year. The children are now experienced students! This month, we are preparing for our first report cards (coming home on Feb. I) with a lot of skills practice and assessments. We will learn about the life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We've begun our next language unit which focuses on animals, handwriting and hearing syllables. In math, numbers 6 through 10! Happy 29th Birthday to Mr. Dom on 1/24!

Happy New Year! Kindergarten is beginning to learn about our 5 Senses. We will be doing lots of hands-on projects! We will be starting to work on comparing length, weight, capacity, and numbers to 10. Our writing is starting to take off!

First graders have been learning about the human body and how the different systems work. We've been reading a lot of nonfiction stories and have begun working on writing our own nonfiction books. We have also been working hard on subtracting numbers from 20.

2nd grade is finishing up learning about holiday traditions around the world. We are continuing our learning of place value and applying it to adding and subtracting large numbers. We are wrapping up matter and will be moving into our geography unit and learning about land forms. We will soon meet with DIA to begin planning our Art and Ed. program with them that will take place in spring! Happy New Year to all our families.

The third grade is working on learning their multiplication facts. Please help them practice at home. In science, we are learning about water around the world. We are working on reading non-fiction text and using text features to support our learning.

The 4th graders are beginning American Exploration and Colonial America in Social Studies / ELA. In Math we are currently working on, and heading towards, Multiples, Factors, Long Division and Two-Digit Multiplication.

It's a good thing we are well-rested from our Winter Recess! January looks to be a very busy month!

In fifth grade, students are excited to be exploring the biodiversity of rainforests as part of their ELA unit. In math, they are working on Module 3, the addition and subtraction of fractions. In science, students are learning about earth systems and how they interact with each other.

With the onset of the cold weather here are some tips from your School Nurse.

Dressing properly is very important. Children should not be coming to school without coats, hats and gloves when the weather is cold. Even if you drop them off or the school bus picks them up; they still need to wear appropriate outerwear. As long as the weather is 26 degrees or above students will go out for lunchtime recess.

The arrival of cold weather brings with it increased cases of illnesses especially influenza, pneumonia, bronchitis and other serious and contagious childhood illnesses. The best way to reduce the spread of these illnesses is to follow the tips that are listed below:

> Please stress the importance of proper hand washing. Children should not be sent to school if they have a fever or have been vomiting Excessive cough, complaint of sore throat, headache, muscular aches or pains are all signs of illness. The student who is not feeling well cannot benefit from instruction and will be the cause of spreading infection to others. We also can never forget the importance of getting a flu vaccine before the winter.
