JOHN ROBINSON Class of 1997

John Robinson, known for his explosive running style in football and his state and national achievements in track and field, is being inducted into the Hall of Fame.

John competed on the Varsity indoor and spring track teams for 6 years, earning All League honors for 4 years and was named Poughkeepsie Journal "Athlete of the Year" 2 times. During his junior year (1996), John was the New York State Indoor 55-meter State Champion. He also placed 4th at the State Spring Track Championships in the 100-meter dash and the 100-meter hurdles.

During John's senior year, he was a Spring Track State Champion in the 110-meter hurdles and qualified for the state championships in the 55-meter dash. He also qualified for the National Track Championship during his junior and senior years for indoor and spring track.

After high school, John competed for the New York Institute of Technology at Farmingdale. There he earned National Junior College All American Honors in the 100-meter hurdles and the long jump.

GARRY "GOOSE" McCRAY Class of 1967

Garry McCray, one of Beacon High School's all time premier basketball players, is being inducted into the Hall of Fame.

Garry played on the Varsity boys basketball teams for 4 years. During that time, the basketball team won 4 DSCL Championships and one Class A Championship.

Garry was named "Most Valuable Player" for three straight seasons in the DCSL and was named "Most Valuable Player" in the Sectional basketball tournament in 1965 and 1967. During his senior year he earned All American honors.

Garry concluded his high school basketball career with 998 points, two points short of the exclusive 1,000 point plateau.

1996 BOYS' BOWLING TEAM

The 1996 Boys' Bowling Team was the first bowling team to win a Section One Championship and a trip to the New York State Championships.

After a second place League finish 71-20 and a $3^{\rm rd}$ place Conference place, the 1996 Boys' Bowling looked forward to the Sectional Championships. After the first 3 games, they were in third place, but ready to make a run at the title. Rallying for a 152 pin deficit the Bulldogs came from behind during the afternoon session to win their first ever Sectional bowling title. Joe Randazzo and John Spear led the way, while Dan Healey and Moose Martin provided a spark off the bench. During the State tournament held at Fishkill Bowl, the boys' finished eighth.
