BEACON HIGH SCHOOL HALL OF FAME Stacy McKeon Antalek Class of 1989

Stacy McKeon Antalek is being inducted into the Hall of Fame as a soccer player. Stacy was a member of Beacon High School's first varsity girl's soccer team in 1986 and become an integral part of the success of the girl's soccer programs from 1986 to 1989. During those years, Stacy played with eventual Beacon Hall of Fame inductees, Sharyn Seaman and Nicole Petrie. From 1986 to 1989 the soccer team won three consecutive league championship and appeared in the section one finals including a section championship in 1988.

Stacy was the team's leading scorer and assist leader in 1986 and 1987. Stacy was an extremely aggressive player who possessed incredible speed and a knack getting to the ball. Throughout her career, Stacy scored three goals in a game fourteen times. In her senior year she scored 30 goals and added 14 assists. She set a school record at that time with 90 career goals and 42 assists. Stacy was All League four years, and was All Section and a first team Poughkeepsie Journal All Star in her senior year.

BEACON HIGH SCHOOL HALL OF FAME Cory Smith Class of 2006

Cory Smith is being inducted into the Hall of Fame as one of Beacon's truly exceptional athletes. He played varsity football for four years and varsity basketball for three. He was a member of the varsity track and field team for four years. Cory was best known for his accomplishments as a football player and a track and field athlete.

Cory was a two time New York State Long Jump medalist. As a junior, he finished fourth at the Spring Track and Field Championships. The following year he jumped 22 feet 11 ¾ inches in a driving rainstorm at St. Lawrence University to be crowned State Champion. His best jump of 23 feet 5 ¼ inches ranks third among Beacon High School long jumpers. He was also a member of the school record 4X100 and shuttle hurdle relays.

During his career as a football player, Cory ran for over 2,800 yards, scored 32 touchdowns and amassed over 3,900 all purpose yards. Before suffering a season ending ankle injury in his senior year, Corey rushed for 748 yards and 9 touchdowns and had a memorable game against Lourdes, when he scored 6 touchdowns; one kickoff return, one punt return, one blocked kick and three rushing. Four of those touchdowns came the first time Cory touched the football.

Cory was All League and All Section in football and track and field and earned numerous team awards.

BEACON HIGH SCHOOL HALL OF FAME Ryan Powers Class of 2006

Ryan Powers is being inducted into the Hall of Fame as a baseball player who earned four varsity letters and became the most acclaimed baseball player ever to have worn Beacon's blue and gold. Ryan also played basketball for four years and was member of the 2003 Section One Championship team who went on to the New York State Final Four.

Ryan was a four year starter at shortstop and also pitched. During his senior year, Ryan set the single season RBI record as he drove in 54 runners in twenty six games. He set career records for at-bats(326), hits(123) and RBI's(117). Ryan was a three time All League and two time All Section baseball player. He was also a two time team most valuable player and Poughkeepsie Journal first team. He was also selected as league most valuable player as a senior. He was named third team All State as a junior and first team All State as a senior. As a result of his performance as a senior, Ryan was named New York State Class A Baseball Player of Year, New York State Baseball Coaches Association Baseball Player of the Year and Beacon High School's first Louisville Slugger All American. Ryan accepted a Division One scholarship to Mississippi State, where he played for two years before concluding his baseball career at Division Two St. Leo's College in Florida.

BEACON HIGH SCHOOL HALL OF FAME Mitchell Katz Class of 2006

Mitchell Katz is being inducted into the Hall of Fame as a diver on the first boys swimming and diving team in the history of Beacon High School. Mitchell qualified for the New York State Diving Championships four times and was the swim program's first sectional champion in 2005. In 2006, Mitchell placed 7th in the New York State Championships.

Mitchell was a Scholar Athlete who set the standard for diving. He currently holds the Beacon High School six and eleven dive records. He earned All Section and All League honors for four consecutive years. He was team captain in his junior and senior years.

Mitchell went on to dive at Division One Marist College for four years. He was a team captain in his junior and senior years. In 2010, Mitch was named to the (MAAC) Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Swimming and Diving All Academic Team. Mitchell is among the top ranked divers in the history of Men's Swimming and Diving at Marist; ranked second in the 1 meter and fifth in 3 meter dives.
