Dear Beacon City School District Community:

I am honored to be the Superintendent of the Beacon City School District and I am thrilled to be finishing my fourth year in the position. I am incredibly proud of the many ways the Beacon City School District stepped up to help our students and community during this challenging past year. We were the largest district in Dutchess County to open its doors for in-person instruction back in September. Thanks to our supportive community and amazing staff, we offered remote learning and in-person learning to all of our students this past year. Our students also participated in musicals, athletics, and enrichment clubs both in-person and virtually. It was very powerful to see our school district and community rise to the challenges of the past year.

Our budget proposal for the coming year allows us to plan for a full return to in-person school for our students next year while also maintaining and strengthening several of the following important initiatives for our students:

- Small class sizes at the elementary level
- Instrumental music beginning in the fourth grade
- Expanded Pre-k programs in the district
- A wide range of course offerings at Beacon High School including 7 AP courses and 7 Dutchess Community College courses
- A strong athletics program with many offerings from modified to the varsity level
- Clubs and extracurriculars at all levels of school
- 1:1 Chromebook initiative for all of our students

If the budget vote does not pass, the district would have to implement a contingency budget. The contingency budget would force us to make \$900,000 of cuts across all areas of the district and it would have a negative impact on the student experience in our district. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns and we hope to have your support with our budget.

Voters will be asked to decide the following:

PROPOSITION #1:2021 -2022 BUDGET

SHALL the budget for the Beacon City School District for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2021, in the amount of \$76,830,000 be adopted, and the necessary taxes to meet such expenditures be levied and collected?

PROPOSITION #2: BUS PURCHASE

SHALL the bond resolution authorizing the purchase of school buses at a maximum cost of \$395,000; authorizing the issuance of \$395,000 bonds (5 year maximum maturity) and, with respect to such bonds, providing for a tax levy therefor in annual installments; pledging the District's faith and credit for debt service; delegating powers with respect to bonds and notes; and providing for an estoppel procedure, be approved?

PROPOSITION #3: STADIUM LAND SALE

SHALL the Board of Education of the Beacon City School District be authorized to sell a +/- 33 acre portion of a 64.75 acre parcel fronting on Route 9D (identified on the Dutchess County Tax Map as Section 6055, Block 1, Lot 182629), upon which the Dutchess Stadium, Intermodal Transportation Facility and associated parking facilities have been erected, to Dutchess County for the sum of \$627,000, and such other terms and conditions as are set forth in the Contract of Sale negotiated between the parties?

ELECTION OF FOUR BOARD OF EDUCATION MEMBERS

The Beacon Board of Education will have four (4) candidates running for four seats at the Election and Budget vote on Tuesday, May 18, 2021:

1. John Galloway Jr. 2. Flora Stadler

The terms are as follows:

• Two members for three year terms commencing: July 1, 2021 and expiring on June 30, 2024

• One member for a three year and six week term commencing: May 18, 2021 and expiring June 30, 2024

3. Jasmine Johnson 4. Elissa Betterbid

• One member for a one year and six week term commencing: May 18, 2021 and expiring on June 30, 2022

*Statement of assumptions made in projecting a contingency budget for the 2021-2022 school year, should the proposed budget be defeated: If the budget does not pass and goes to contingency, "cost of living" increases are not allowed. Therefore the operating budget would have to be cut by approximately \$900,000. Since other costs have increased, this would mean significant cuts in programs and activities, which may include: Increase class sizes. Eliminate non-core classes such as art, music and electives. Cuts to Athletics, Clubs, and Student Activities at all levels. Cut non-mandatory equipment purchases. Charge full cost of facility use to all non-school organizations. Reduce/eliminate school related building use after hours.


