3. Legislative

- Open Meetings (NYS): Updates from LHEC legal advisor
- Bill S7666A (NYS): Currently no updates, although there may be reluctance in both houses to move this forward. Should we create advocacy around this issue?
- Changes to Title IX (Federal): Education Secretary Miguel Cardona is changing some Trump-era rules regarding sexual assault at school, and is expected to codify safeguards for transgender students for the first time, handling both issues in the same rule. By revising Title IX, the federal education law that prohibits sex-based discrimination, Cardona will be undoing a key legacy of former Education Secretary Betsy DeVos. More here. Also, Lawmakers in 19 states want legal refuge for transgender youth
- Section 504 (Federal): This landmark disability civil rights law prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in public and private programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance, including schools.
