- a. - c. Local Progress advocacy wants to change focus of COPS (Community Oriented Policing Services) Hiring Program through the Dept of Justice. - We're awaiting NYSSBA's response on this.
- d. <u>BOE statement on Executive Budget</u> Asking the Board if we're ok sending a Letter to the Editor of the Highlands Current, sharing BCSD budget issues and our legislative response.
- e. Changes to Department of Health guidelines for schools based on what we've learned since last year. Speaking with legislators before moving ahead with any advocacy on this.
