### 1. Issues & Legislation

- a. Upcoming election
  - Press release Sent to Highlands Current, publishing this week
- b. State budget: Release an update once NYS budget is passed, focused on how it impacts BCSD. Highlights include:
  - \$1.4 billion increase in Foundation Aid, 3-year full phase-in of aid
  - Ensures that additional Federal Aid will supplement, and not supplant State funding.
  - Aid categories will NOT be consolidated
  - District STAR payments will NOT be cut

#### 2. Advocacy

- a. Look at issues covered in new NYSSBA <u>legislative priorities</u> and <u>position</u> <u>statements</u> and prepare responses as needed
- b. NYSSBA Resolutions to propose (<a href="https://bit.ly/31UbT0T">https://bit.ly/31UbT0T</a>) These are just drafts.
  - School Start Time
    - Extremely early school start times are detrimental to a student's learning and health. In fact, according to the American Academy of Pediatricians, inadequate sleep in adolescents can lead to obesity, diabetes, increased anxiety, depression, cognitive impairment, memory problems, and drowsy driving. Ultimately, these issues impact academic achievement and graduation rates. New York State must set limits on the start time for schools, to be no earlier than 8 am.
      - Matt will discuss this with school leadership in the region. Flora will bring up with DCSBA
  - Board Member Stipends
    - School board members provide an important public service that directly impacts children and communities. Because of this impact, school boards should represent the diversity of the communities they serve. As a volunteer position that requires a serious time commitment with no financial compensation, board membership can be a challenge. A small stipend would pose minimal cost to a district's overall budget, while reducing a possible barrier to participation and encouraging broader participation in this key decision-making role.
