# BHS-DCC Concurrent Enrollment Program

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### **DCC Concurrent Enrollment Program**

Concurrent enrollment, sometimes called dual credit, refers to a course where a student is earning both high school and college credit for one course, which is taught at Beacon High School by a BHS instructor (who has been approved by Dutchess Community College).

- Students in the concurrent enrollment program are required to meet the same standards as all other DCC students.
- The courses completed through the concurrent enrollment program have to meet the same academic expectations as campus-based instruction.
- Students in the concurrent enrollment program are considered non-matriculated, part-time
   DCC students.
- 18% of Dutchess County public high school students take courses concurrently at DCC.
- One-third of Dutchess County public high school graduates who attend college, choose DCC.
- At BHS in 2022-23, we are running 29 sections of DCC courses (583 total enrollments).

#### What We Know

- DCC plans to charge students \$70/credit.
- Students who qualify for free- or reduced-lunch will be charged \$35/credit.
- The BCSD is exploring additional funding opportunities for students who qualify for free- or reduced-lunch.
- Our Board continues to advocate at the County and State levels for funding.

#### What We Don't Know

- How payment will be made to DCC, and on what schedule.
- Whether students will be able to take the course without accepting college credit and paying tuition.
