Overview



The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)

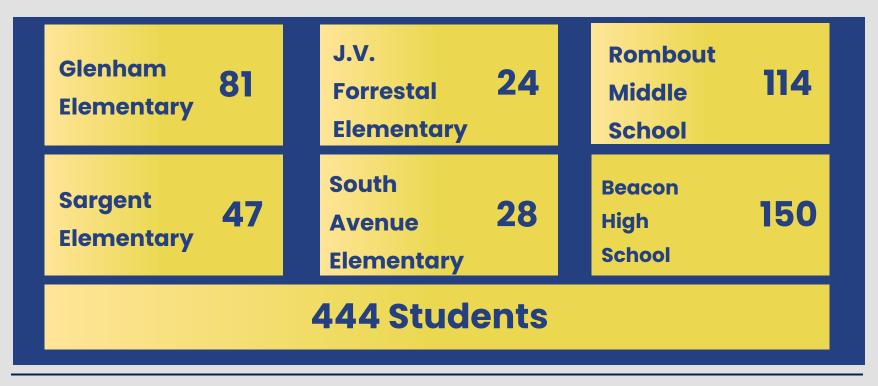
Federal law that ensures students with disabilities have access to a free appropriate public education, provides guidelines for special education services, protects students' and caregivers' rights, and supports early intervention programs. Part 200 Regulations by the New York State Education Department (NYSED)

Provide comprehensive guidance and requirements for the identification, evaluation, individualized education programming, service delivery, procedural safeguards, and disciplinary procedures for students with disabilities in New York State to ensure they receive a <u>free and appropriate</u> <u>public education in the least restrictive environment.</u>

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act

Federal Law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in any program or activity that receives federal financial assistance, including public schools, colleges and universities, and many private schools.

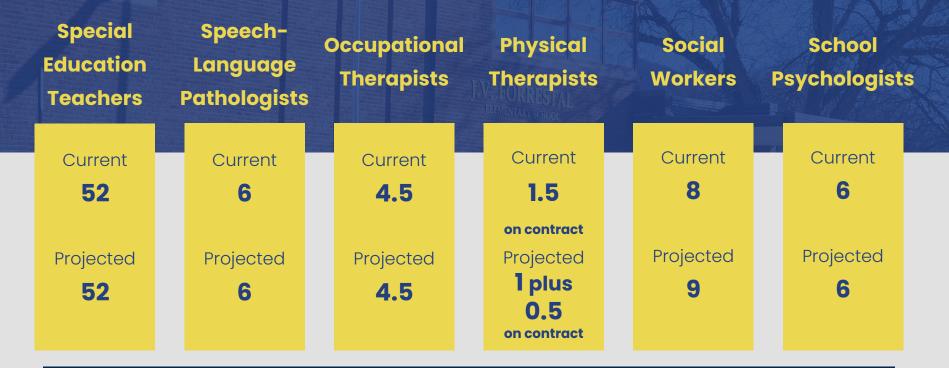
Students with Supports : IDEA In-District



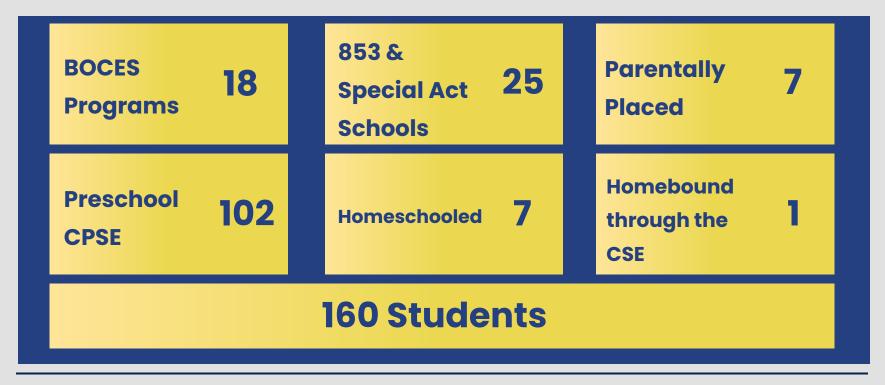
Students with Supports : Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

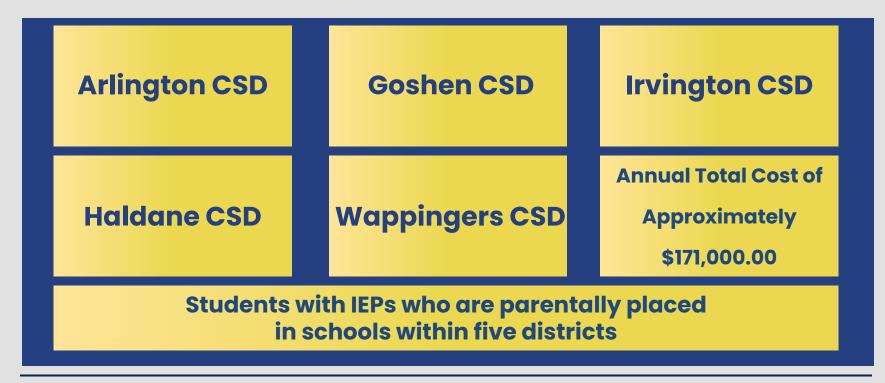
