
Congratulations to the Girls Varsity Basketball team who finished their season 18-3 and made it to the semi-finals of sectional play. The top seeded Bulldogs were able to capture a league title and defeat their long time rival Our Lady of Lourdes High School this season. The Bulldogs accomplished their preseason goals, one of which was to make it to the sectional semi-finals at the Westchester County Center. This year's team was led by All Section, Division I St. Peter's bound Talah Hughes and a supporting cast of seniors who will be greatly missed next season. Congratulations to Talah Hughes, Brooke Dennin, Mary Jacketti, Emma Haran and Sara Nesheiwat as they graduate from Beacon High School. Their leadership and talent will be greatly missed. The Bulldogs will return a core of dedicated and talented players to the squad next year led by all section, all league players Lauren Schetter and Leandra Echi. This team never faltered in the face of adversity and was determined to win at all costs. This was demonstrated in their quarter-final over-time win against Tappan Zee. The Lady Bulldogs were dominant this year because of their defensive intensity and willingness to play as a team with contributions from all. A special thanks to Larry Dahl the scorekeeper and assistant coaches Randy Casale and Rachel Ormsby for their assistance and dedication this season. And congratulations to Christina Dahl for being named League Coach of the Year.

"Beacon Jumpers headline the top ranked NYS Class B team"

The Varsity Indoor Track team just completed one of its most successful seasons ever. The Boys team finished the season as the number 1 ranked Class B team in New York State. Individually, the team sent three boys and one girl to the state championship in Cornell. Sophomore Paige Baisley qualified in the high jump after finishing 2nd in the section with a leap of 5 feet 2 inches. She finished 22nd at the state meet. Senior James Brown made it to the podium in his 3rd trip to the State Championship, garnering 6th place in the high jump with a leap of 6 feet 4 inches.

In the Long Jump pit, two spectacular talents, Terrel Davis and Rayvon Grey, both qualified for the State Championship as sophomores. Terrel and Rayvon became the first sophomores at states to make the finals in the Long Jump since 2007. Terrel tied his personal best of 21' 6" in finishing 9th and Rayvon set his 3rd personal record (PR) in as many meets as he soared 22 feet 11 1/2 inches to finish 2nd. This is Beacon's 3rd state runner-up in the past four indoor seasons (Victoria Alexander - 55 meters; Alex Bowen - High Jump(2011)). Rayvon's jump was the 2nd longest in history by a New York State sophomore. He is now nationally ranked US #31 and is US #4 amongst sophomores.

To refute the notion that all the track team does is jump, Rayvon teamed with David Adams, Brandon Booker, and Justice Telesco to qualify for the prestigious Millrose Games on February 15th. They qualified by running a school record 3:31.47 in the 4x400 relay, a time that also ranks as the top time in the state for a Class B school. David Adams also set a school record in the 300 meters of 36,29 and a sophomore record for the 55 meter hurdles of 8.15 seconds. Both times ranked in the top five of Section 1.





GRELLA GOES TO NYS WRESTLING CHAMPIOSHIP FINALS

Andrew Grella became Beacon's first wrestler to advance to the New York State wrestling championship finals, only to lose to Reggie Williams from Johnson City (Section IV) by the score of 5-1. Andrew's 2nd place finish at 195 lbs. was the highest place finisher of the nine Beacon wrestlers who have qualified for the state championship since 1970. En route to the finals, Andrew beat Nnamdi Uchendu (PSAL – Springfield Gardens) 18-7, Trent Egenlauf (Section V – Spencerport) 5-1 and in the semi-finals Erik Jessell (Section IX – Cornwall) with a 1:07 pin.

Andrew and his brother Vincent were both Section One Champions and NYS place finishers. Andrew has committed to wrestling at Division I University Binghamton where his brother is currently a member of the wrestling team.



Andrew had a stellar season for the Bulldogs. His final record was 45-3 and won five tournament championships along with four tournament Most Outstanding Wrestler awards. He also earned All League, All Section, All State honors. Andrew led the team in most statistical categories including 25 season pins.

PHILLIPS COMMITS TO VILLANOVA

Taurus Phillips signed a letter of intent to attend Villanova University on a football scholarship. Taurus became

Beacon's first football player since Bryan Walker signed a Division I football scholarship in 1988 to Northeastern University. Taurus was highly recruited by other schools including, Nebraska, Arkansas, Albany, UConn and Maine.

Taurus Phillips had a breakout season this year for the Beacon football team. He led the team to a 5-4 record and helped them score 259 points for the season. Taurus finished the season with 1074 yards rushing and 9 rushing TD's which resulted in over 13 yards per carry. He had 248 yards receiving and 3 receiving TD's and also threw for 3 scores and had a kick return for a TD as well.



RADWAN SIGNS SOCCER SCHOLARSHIP TO UCONN

Noriana Radwan signed a letter of intent to play soccer at the University of Connecticut. Noriana is the first Beacon High School Soccer player to receive a Division I soccer scholarship.

Noriana was a member of the high school varsity girl's soccer team for five years. She overcame a serious concussion in her freshman year and a torn ACL in her junior year. Despite the injuries she was still able to receive a full athletic scholarship. Noriana spent the off seasons playing soccer for AAU soccer to improve her soccer skills and was recognized by college coaches.

Noriana is excited to be member of the Huskies soccer team in the fall.


