### Message from the Athletic Director

This year's athletes have added another proud chapter in the rich history of the Beacon High School athletic program by excelling in the classroom as well as in athletics.

Our athletes need to be commended for their outstanding performance in the classroom. Nearly 65% of our athletes attained a grade point average of over 85% and a record **19** of our varsity teams won the NYS Scholar Team Athlete Award. This year's Girls Golf Team earned the highest GPA among our varsity teams with an average of 96.1. Many of our graduating seniors will be attending some of the most prestigious colleges and universities in the country, which include; Columbia, Harvard, Villanova, Brandeis, Temple and Annapolis.

In athletic competition many athletes set personal and school records and others were recognized as All League, All Section and All State. The girl's tennis and baseball teams won league champions. James Brown, Erik Gaster and Paige Baisley represented Beacon in the NYS Indoor Track Championships. Paige Rutkoske, Addisen Rutkoske, Kassey Gonzalez and Emmanuale Palikuca qualified for the NYS Girls Swimming Championships. Paige and James placed 6<sup>th</sup> in the state championships. Paige Baisley competed in the NYS Spring Track and Field Championships where she finished 12th in the high jump. And finally, who can forget the memorable season the baseball team had! The team was led by Section One, League and County Pitcher of the Year Tony Romanelli and League Player of the year Patrick Schetter. Both were also named Pitcher and Player of the Year for MSG.

All of our teams were competitive and our athletes represented Beacon, with pride and dignity. Most importantly, as athletic director, it is very rewarding to hear so many positive comments from opposing coaches, spectators and athletic directors on how our athletes handled themselves in victory and in defeat. "Class" was the word most used to describe some of our teams and athletes. That is what I am most proud of!

Our student athletes have met the demands of a rigorous academic program and high levels of athletic competition. It was their teachers who challenged them to think on a higher level and coaches who taught them the values of hard work, dedication and commitment in becoming a complete student athlete. It is these people that expected more of our athletes and wouldn't let them settle for mediocrity. Many years from now, it is likely that their teachers and coaches will be the ones they most vividly remember from their high school years.

At the Athletic Awards night on June 4th we celebrated the accomplishments of our athletes who spent many hours completing homework assignments, studying for exams and cramming to meet deadlines for term papers and projects. As part of an athletic team, they have spent countless hours practicing and competing in the gym and pool and on the fields, track and tennis courts. They have endured setbacks, challenges and obstacles. There were times of jubilation and disappointment and through it all, each and every one of them have worked long and hard to be the student athlete who have made their parents and school so proud.

To the seniors, I bid them farewell and best wishes in their future endeavors. Our underclassmen should set their goals high and continue to work hard to reach them. Next year will be an exciting one with so many talented athletes returning.

On behalf of the high school faculty and administration and the Board of Education, we are all proud of your accomplishments. I extend my most sincere congratulations to all of our athletes.

# BASEBALL WINS LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Beacon Bulldog varsity baseball achieved heights not seen since the section and regional championship team of 1998 as they completed an awesome run through the Section One tournament before falling in the championship game to John Jay Cross River. The Bulldogs completed the regular season with a 13-7 record and won their second consecutive league championship. Regular season highlights included defeating Arlington (#1 in NYS), John Jay (#3 in section 1) and Ketcham (#5 in section 1) and finishing second in the third annual Spring Bash tournament. The season was highlighted by the undefeated pitching of All-American and Section 1 Pitcher of the Year Tony Romanelli and who will ever forget the three home run, seven RBI performance including the three run walkoff against Panas by League MVP Patrick Schetter, who also had his 100th hit during the season. The Bulldogs earned the number four seed in the Section One tournament and defeated league rival #13 Hen Hud 9-3 in the opening round. In the quarterfinals, the Bulldogs defeated #5 Pelham 7-4 behind the pitching of Tony Romanelli earning a berth against top seeded Tappan Zee in the semis. Against the #1 Dutchman, the Bulldogs showcased their offensive firepower pounding out a 13-3 victory led by Patrick Schetter's offense (4-5, 3 doubles, 5 RBI's) and pitching. Unfortunately, the offense struggled in the championship game as the Bulldogs fell to the JJCR Indians 2-1. The team was guided by Coach Bob Atwell who earned League and County Coach of the Year honors.

## BEACON JUMPERS SHINE AT THE NCAA'S AND THE NYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

"A spotlight was placed on Beacon's high jumpers, both current and former, in the first week of June. On Friday night, June 7th, Beacon alumni (2011) Alex Bowen competed in his 1st NCAA championship as a Sophomore representing SUNY Albany. He successfully cleared 7 feet 2 1/2 inches enroute to an 11th place finish. Of his 3 attempts at the next height (7' 4 1/4") his father reported that the first and third attempts were extremely close to success. Had he been able to clear that height, it would have represented a new personal best and moved him into the top 6 in the country. The top two finishers are both graduating seniors and represented the United States in last summer's London Olympics. Alex's long term goals include qualifying for the US Olympic squad competing at the 2016 Olympics in Brazil. In the near term he plans to be at Drake University on June 20th to defend the junior national championship that he won last year."

"The following day, one of Beacon's next generation of high jumpers competed at the New York State High School Championships at Middletown, New York. Paige Baisley, only a freshman, finished 12th in the state in the girl's large school division. Paige accomplished the impressive feat of qualifying for both the indoor and outdoor state championships this year, clearing a personal best 5 feet 4 inches this season. She is currently ranked NYS #3 for freshman and is a leading contender to be a state medalist at her very next State Championship."

## **Eight Teams and 204 Spring Athletes Earn Academic Excellence**

This spring season, all eight varsity teams earned the NYSPHSAA Scholar Team Athlete Award; Baseball, Softball, Boys and Girls Golf, Boys and Girls Track, Boys Tennis and Girls Lacrosse. This was the first time all varsity teams in a season earned the Team Scholar Athlete Award. 67% of the 304 athletes who participated in spring sports maintained an average of 85 or better. The girls golf team had the highest GPA among all the varsity teams in the athletic program with a 96.1 GPA.

Our coaches have done a tremendous job making academic achievement a priority. It is through the efforts of coaches and teachers working together, that our athletes have been able to attain academic success.

### **Paige Rutkoske Signs Letter of Intent to Annapolis**

Paige Rutkoske signed a letter of intent to attend the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis and became the second Beacon High School graduate to attend a service academy in the last three years. Ryan Tompkins is currently a cadet at West Point. Paige is the first Beacon High School student to attend Annapolis since the 1970's.

Paige was a record setting swimmer for the "Lady Bulldogs" the past six years and plans to swim for Annapolis as a Midshipman. As a student athlete at Beacon High School, Paige competed in the New York State Championships for four consecutive years. She has a 101.6 GPA and is ranked 6<sup>th</sup> in the senior class. Paige was named as Beacon High School's Most Outstanding Senior Athlete.

Paige will report to Annapolis on June 27<sup>th</sup> for Induction Day, the beginning of a rigorous training program known as Plebe Summer. She hopes to become a helicopter pilot or a Marine after the academy.

## **EMILY ERACA SETS THE STANDARD FOR GIRLS' GOLF**

There have been literally thousands of athletes over the years who have proudly adorned the colors of Beacon High School while representing our school in a plethora of athletic events and various sports. It can be said with absolute certainty that no single athlete has ever played such a role in developing a single sport than that of six-year varsity golfer Emily Eraca, who singlehandedly helped to establish and develop the sport of Girls' Varsity Golf. Emily will be graduating Beacon High School having set nearly every single individual golf scoring record imaginable.

The golf program got underway six years ago when Emily was a short, skinny, impressionable seventh grader with braces, and it was with great pride that I was able to witness her maturation into the wonderful young woman she has become. While in middle school, she performed admirably on the course; often defeating opponents three, four, even five years older than she. It was clear to all that her potential as an athlete was limitless.

Yet, it was when Emily was a freshman that players and coaches alike began paying particular attention to her natural ability, as it was at this time she truly became a force to be reckoned with. Emily was edging ever closer to qualifying for sectional accolades, and she firmly implanted her identity on the team. It is important to note that this was also one of the more important years in the development of our program, as many girls who began with us two and three years prior had since graduated. Emily took it upon herself to recruit new girls, a move which certainly saved our team from imminent extinction.

Emily's body of work as an athlete is defined by her efforts in her high school years, as during this time she played at a level well beyond many others. As a sophomore, she qualified for the sectional tournament, the first time anyone from BHS had accomplished this. She then qualified for the sectionals as a junior and senior and finished in the top twenty of all the girls in Section One.

During Emily's stellar high school career, she earned many awards, honors, and accolades. She was named our team's Most Valuable Player four times. She was selected All-League and All-Conference twice and was a Poughkeepsie Journal All Star.

Upon graduation, Emily will be going to Siena College.






